SCHEDULE A

### Face covering REQUIRED

## MASKS ARE NOW MANDATORY

To help bend the curve and save lives, wearing a mask is now mandatory in all indoor public spaces and workplaces across Alberta.

Whether you're inside or outdoors, wearing a non-medical mask is an effective way to protect yourself and others when physical distancing may not be possible.

Those experiencing flu like symptoms are asked not to attend Mass in person. The Dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is still in effect. Livestreaming of our 10:30 Sunday Mass will continue.

We are limited to 1/3 fire code occupancy. As we have continued operating at this capacity for most of our Masses pre-registration is not required. Please come early. The doors will be locked once we have reached our capacity of 130 people. There is an additional Latin Mass at 1:45pm.

Wearing face masks inside the church facility is mandatory for all the faithful. Parishioners who are not able to wear a mask for medical reasons can be exempt except when receiving Holy Communion. The use of hand sanitizer at the entrance and exit to the church is encouraged. Kindly practice respiratory etiquette.

Congregational singing is suspended at this time. Physical distancing is required between non-related households, inside and outside the church.

## Pastoral Notes

### The Leadership of Jesus

In this time of elections, this Sunday Gospel teaches us an important lesson on Leadership. The example of Christ's leadership invites us to reflect on what moves our politicians to run for office. It is no secret that once power is achieved, there is a certain desire for more and more power, that in the end corrupts us. However, Christ's leadership is not anchored in power but in service; service which should be mirrored by his followers.

No matter what background we may have, all of us are given the opportunity and responsibility to exercise leadership in our lives. As a guideline, the gospel points to the leadership that translates into service to our neighbour. Thus, service motivates us to leave behind any sort of egocentric or selfish desire, so that we may serve others' needs and respect them.

Serving others and respect for others is to be fostered in the Domestic Church – The Family. Every member of the family is called to serve one another. "Parents have the first responsibility for the education of their children in the faith, prayer, and all the virtues. They have the duty to provide as far as possible for the physical and spiritual needs of their children" (CCC 2252). It is a two-way street. Parents are to serve their children, as children are to serve their parents, by showing them respect, being obedient to them and assisting them.

During this time of elections, those who run for office are to exercise their service to the citizens, taking on the responsibility to respect the dignity of the individual and to protect families (cf. CCC 2254). Therefore, it is paramount that the leadership the future elected officials will exercise for our country may mirror the example of the leadership of our Lord.

Before heading to the polls, say a prayer, and ask the Lord that he may lead the heart of the future elected officials to serve and lead in the same way he taught us to serve one another.

### HEALING CORNER

Try this simple exercise of imagination. Place yourself in the center of the Twelve alongside of Jesus. In your mind's eye, face Jesus and watch him embrace you. Do you feel the strength of his arms, the tenderness of his touch, the warmth of his hands? Do you feel the strength of his love? After the exercise, think about those in your life that need the embrace of Christ? How can you help them to receive that embrace?

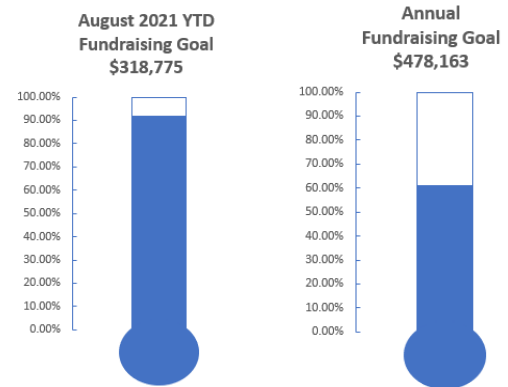

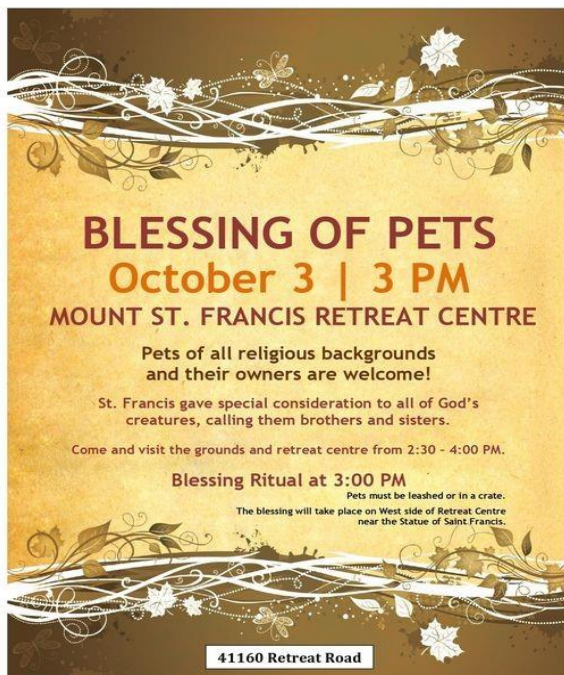
