Pastoral Notes

A Channel of Grace and Healing

We are different from who we were yesterday. The majority of us are on the constant lookout to better ourselves, by way of more discipline, exercise, reading, studying, and a myriad of ways, so to be better than yesterday.

Having our Lord by our side is a great help. As Christians, we cannot pretend to experience change in our life if we disregard our Lord. Jesus leads us to a change of heart towards the oppressed, the marginalised, the lonely, the poor, the hungry. On our own, no real change is possible, but if we allow the Lord to touch us, even hearts of stone will melt into hearts of flesh (cf. Eze 11:19).

The Lord is constantly calling us to open our eyes to look after those who are in the peripheries. By his touch, he can open our eyes, unplug our ears and release our tongues to serve our neighbour. We have to allow the Lord's touch in our life, for when he does that, we are not only changed but in turn we are enabled to be channels of Christ, and touch others from what puts them down. It is by our own ministry in the community that we can bring Christ to others.

The Gospel of Mark brings a foreshadowing of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The Catechism of the Catholic Church in number 1499 says about this Sacrament: "By the sacred anointing of the sick and the prayer of the priests the whole Church commends those who are ill to the suffering and glorified Lord, that he may raise them up and save them. And indeed she exhorts them to contribute to the good of the People of God by freely uniting themselves to the Passion and death of Christ."

The anointing we witness in the Gospel, should invite us to change and to be diligent ministers to those who need anointing, to assist the priest in his ministerial duties, and to bring the healing and consolation of Christ to the life of those who need Him the most. We are the hands and feet of the Lord.

Jesus is knocking at your door so that through your hands he may wipe the tears of the sorrowing; through your hands, he may feed the hungry; through your hands healing may be brought to the sick. Jesus is knocking at your door to change your heart, to become a channel of his grace and healing.

HEALING CORNER Lord, thank you for my life and all the good things you have given me. Help me to realize that you have created everything and that all I have is from you. May I use all I have to serve others and as a means to come closer to you, the source of all good.

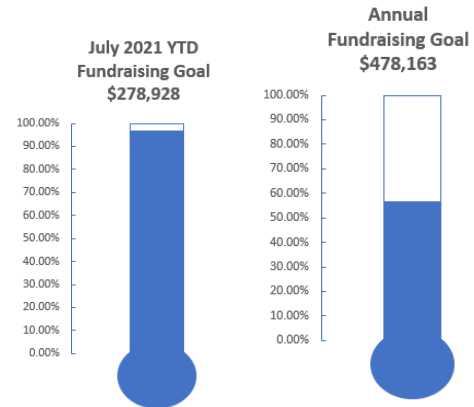

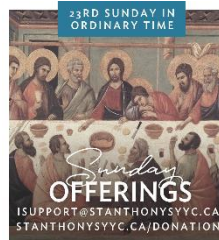

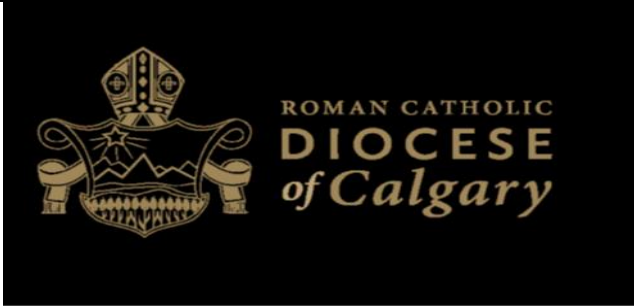
