Process the Book of the Gospels in front of the priest during the entrance hymn. The lector approaches the Altar with the Book of the Gospels ahead of the priest, places it on the wooden stand and returns to the aisle to bow with the priest.

Proclaim the 1st Reading, and step down from the Ambo. (Sit on the bench while the cantor sings the Psalm). After the Psalm return to the ambo and proclaim the 2nd Reading from the Lectionary and return to your seat. The cantor will sing the Gospel Acclamation.

Halfway through the creed return to the Ambo to prepare for the General Intercessions.
