Pastoral Notes

The Unqualified Prophet?

Amos never wanted to be a prophet of the Lord. While individuals in his time would join prophet guilds or spend their lives studying the Torah and other religious works of the People of God to prepare themselves to be prophets, Amos tells us he was a dresser of sycamore trees by trade and it seems was not in the least bit interested in becoming a "professional" prophet.

Yet the Lord called him from his work to be God's prophet and convey a difficult message to the people of his time, chastising them for focusing on their wealth and comfort as the priority of their lives while neglecting the needy who were in their midst. We can assume Amos knew this was difficult news many did not want to hear but faithful to his prophetic call he knew he had to speak the words that God had given him.

We too might find ourselves in a similar situation to Amos in that he is calling us to live our Christian lives in a way we did not expect and to convey challenging messages to those who need to change their lives in order to draw closer to God.

Let us not be afraid if we find ourselves in this situation! Our Lord promised to send the Holy Spirit to us in these difficult moments, filling us with insights and providing us with words we might not have thought we were able to utter.

God will equip those He has called to carry out the plans He has in store for them. Let us pray for one another today to always trust in the Lord and His ways!

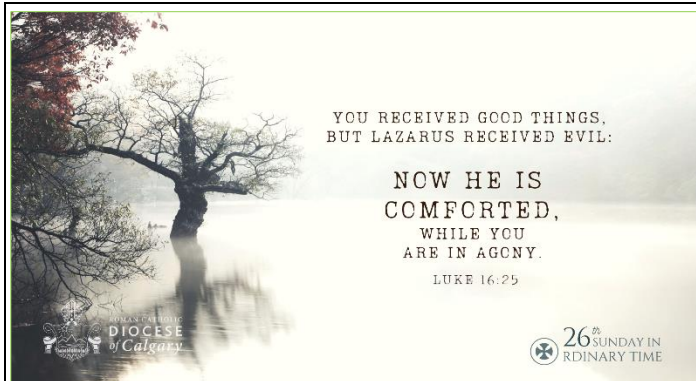

St. Anthony's Finance Update

My name is Don Goodfellow, a member of St. Anthony's Finance Committee, and I would like to take a few minutes to update you about St. Anthony's Together in Action (TIA) 2022 campaign as well as our parish's operations to date.

First and foremost, we would like to thank all who have made their TIA contribution for this year—your generosity towards helping those in need is truly appreciated. And our thanks to all who have continued with their regular offertory giving by your weekly envelope donations, online credit card or monthly pre-authorized contributions. You may recall that **St. Anthony's TIA target set by the diocese is \$40, 949**, which reflects pre-pandemic targets. **To date, \$13,211 has been collected toward this target, thus we are approximately \$28,000 short as of today**—we have three and a half months left to meet and hopefully even exceed our target. **Last year, thanks to all of you, we had a very successful campaign in that we exceeded our target by \$15, 209** which was then donated to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul to support their charitable works. For this year, our parish plans to allocate 50% of any surplus funds above target, to the Central fund for any future parish repairs and maintenance, and 50% to St. Anthony's food hamper program. We pray that this year, your generosity and compassion in responding to the needs of the members of our community during these challenging times will continue

Regarding our parish operations for this year, I regret to say that we are in uncharted waters in that to date, **we have an operating deficit of approximately \$80,000 for the 8 months ending August 31**. St. Anthony's has not been immune to the financial crippling effect of the pandemic. The church's operating expenses continued even though in person worshipping was not in place for the better part of this period.

We, as a parish community have always journeyed together in following Christ's example of love and charity—we encourage everyone to continue this journey of selfless love by making your contribution to the TIA campaign as soon as possible, and certainly by the end of the campaign term, December 31 and also to continue your ongoing support of the operations of our parish—St. Anthony's relies on this support for maintenance, growth and outreach. **Let us take up this incredible challenge to walk in Jesus' path to be the ones to take care of others, and our parish.**


