Pastoral Notes


The Tree of Jesse

A popular devotional image during the Medieval Period was a Jesse Tree. It usually showed an elderly seated man with a large tree with multiple branches coming out of his back. The old man was Jesse, the father of King David. On each of the branches were depicted the descendants of King David, with the top of the Jesse tree showing a shoot in the form of a straight stem with flowers of which was depicted the Blessed Virgin holding the Christ Child.

This image was a vivid way to show the connection between King David and Jesus to affirm that his lineage was that of the kings of Israel and he was truly both Son of David and Son of God. The Jesse Tree was also a fulfillment of the prophecy of Isaiah which we hear this Sunday about the one who would come from the stump of Jesse and have a Spirit of Wisdom, Knowledge, Understanding, Counsel, Might, and Fear of the Lord.

If those attributes of the spirit sound familiar, it is because they are known as the Gifts of the Holy Spirit (the Church added the life of piety to this list from Isaiah) that one receives with the Sacrament of Confirmation.

May we take time this week to consider how well we have been using these Gifts of the Holy Spirit that we received at Confirmation. If perhaps you were not confirmed, please reach out to the Parish Office to learn how you too can receive this wonderful sacrament.





St. Anthony's Updates

An Update from the Parish Finance Council

First and foremost, we would like to thank all who have made their TIA contribution for this year—your generosity towards helping those in need is truly appreciated. Since our last update in September, we have received an additional \$2000, bringing our total collected to date to approximately \$21,200. You may recall that St. Anthony's TIA target set by the diocese is \$40,949, which reflects pre-pandemic levels, thus we are approximately \$19,800 short of our target as of today-we have one month left to meet and hopefully even exceed our target. If the target is not met through specific TIA contributions, our parish is required to make up the shortfall through our operating funds. For this year, our parish plans to allocate 50% of any surplus funds above target, to the Central fund for any future parish repairs and maintenance, and 50% to St. Anthony's food hamper program. We pray that this year, your generosity and compassion in responding to the needs of the members of our community during these challenging times will continue and that we will meet and even exceed our target by December 31.

Regarding our parish operations for this year, since our last update in September, I regret to say that we still have an operating deficit. However, there is some good news-we have seen a reduction of this deficit to approximately \$68,000 for the 10 months ending October 31. St. Anthony's has not been immune to the financial crippling effect of the pandemic. The church's operating expenses continued even though in person worshipping was not in place for the better part of this period. Again, our thanks to all who have continued with their regular offertory giving through the weekly envelopes, online credit card or month pre-authorized contributions.


