
To be Salt and Light

Many of us can remember when St John Paul II made his final visit to Canada for the World Youth Day celebration in Toronto in 2002. I was preparing to depart for the University of McGill that Fall and for a variety of reasons did not attend this celebration and see the pope for the second time, my first being in Paris in 1997. My parents and younger brother Adam did attend and so it remained for me to watch over my two younger brothers and decide to what extent I would watch TV coverage of the event.

I'll admit I did not follow much of World Youth Day 2002, but I did watch when St John Paul II slowly walked down the stairs from airplane once he arrived in Canada. It seemed like an eternity as the ailing pontiff slowly took a step, rested, steadied himself and prepared for the next agonizing step. Many in the crowd were visibly moved and even the usually uncharitable news broadcasters of our nation let silence reign as the Vicar of Christ showed to the world not just how fragile his health was but how in revealing his weakness, he showed us the redemptive value of suffering in the twilight of life.

It so happened that the theme of that World Youth Day was to be salt of the earth and light of the world. St. John Paul II revealed himself to be salt and light as he slowly walked down those stairs. He showed us what it means to be preserved in faith, just as salt keeps food from spoiling. So too was his faith in Christ preserved in his willingness to serve and show what it means to persevere with Christ to the end. He was also a light for the world to see, in revealing that one's dignity is not robbed when sickness and pain sets in but that by offering up that suffering for the redemptive good of others, and visibly for all to see, it shows us how the light of Christ is often found in the darkness of tribulations but not without a ray of light breaking in.

May we strive to be salt and light in the ordinary and heroic ways we live our faith in thought, word and deed.

FRANCISCAN MISSIONARIES OF MARY CALGARY

WHO ARE WE? COME AND SEE....

SISTER ANNE (BENIN), SISTER CARMELITA (PHILIPPINES), SISTER MARIA RITA (INDIA), SISTER THERESE (CONGO),

What place has a life consecrated to God have in the post-COVID pandemic world? Let's have a look at what these four Franciscan Missionaries of Mary have to say:

"For us, being F.M.M is a gift of God – a gift inviting us to participate in the offering of Christ..."to live in kindness and love, with all peoples, of all walks of life and ages – at the service of the poor and marginalized; to the youth and the aged... to families ... to bring justice as artisans of peace"

In 1877, Blessed Mary of the Passion founded the Institute of the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary in Ootacamund, Tamil Nadu, India. Our Mother Foundress, Mary of the Passion, a vibrant, determined woman of vision stated: "the Institute of the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary shall be universal or it will not be". She wrote in accordance with the wishes of the Holy See, they will establish houses in even the most perilous and remote foreign mission. 130 years ago, four sisters arrived in Canada on May 20, 1892 – 15 years after the foundation of the Institute.

Thanks to the Little Franciscans of Mary who opened the doors of Canada for us. The first foundation was in Quebec, Grand – Alley – with the Novitiate. It began with the 24 hours Perpetual Adoration Center and in 1898, our chapel became the seat of perpetual adoration for all of Canada. Our F.M.M mission developed quickly and continued in accordance with our apostolates and possibilities taking into account our ages. In 1897, our sisters landed in St Laurent – a Metis Village – on the shore of the vast Lake Manitoba – they even advanced further North to the Pine Creek OJIBWAY reservation. We have missions in QUEBEC, ONTARIO, MANITOBA, ALBERTA, NUNAVUT. In 1992, we arrived at Repulse Bay in the NORTHWEST TERRITOIRES, with a sister of the Sisters of Nicolet who generously collaborated with us in this mission. Here in Calgary, several sisters have come and gone since we arrived in 1983.

As FMM we are sisters of diverse culture and nationality. We embrace a life of total giving as we pronounce VOWS of POVERTY, of OBEDIENCE and CHASTITY for the sake of the Kingdom. We live vowed life as FRANCISCANS - a life of SIMPLICITY and POVERTY; MISSIONARIES - ready to serve in our capacity to whatever life of service we are called; and MARIAN - following Mary's footsteps, her simplicity, honesty, love and service. We draw our strength from JESUS - the EUCHARIST - the real MISSIONARY. For that, we make our daily adoration before Him exposed, imploring his mercy, protection and guidance in our missionary life. He is the reason for everything we do.

Our calling invites us to be available in many diverse, interesting and challenging ways. As we journey with families who need accompaniment in prayer, with our Associates, with those who live alone; with the sick; with those who need direction – by phone, as well as enlightenment for direction in life – we feel the need to be open, humble and grateful for their trust and simplicity – for when JESUS calls – like Mary, we hasten to respond. It's a CALL of GRACE and manifold blessings that money can't buy.... it's a CALL of LOVE.
