



Pastoral Update from Fr. Nathan

The usual content for which a priest will fashion a Sunday homily is the readings for that Sunday. But he is not limited to them and can also find within the prayers of a Mass a source for reflection, especially when the prayers speak of pressing matters in the life of a parish community.

After the preparation of the altar, we will hear the following prayer over the offerings: "O God, who give us the gift of true prayer and of peace, graciously grant that, through this offering, we may do fitting homage to your divine majesty and, by partaking of the sacred mystery, we may be faithfully united in mind and heart. Through Christ our Lord, Amen."

The essence of this prayer gets at the heart of every celebration of the Holy Mass, where we rejoice that we can gather in our parish church, a place where prayer and peace are to reign in our hearts, to worship God, receive the sacred mystery, that is, The Body and Blood of Christ, and in doing so, be more and more united to God.

It is a tremendous gift that God gives to a parish community to have a church building for the Holy Mass to be celebrated within and it is our ongoing obligation and challenge to continue to keep it a fitting and sustainable House of Prayer for many years to come.

Permit me today to make the remainder of this reflection an important financial update, in particular, a new chapter in the life of the parish as we embark on some major capital projects.

Last year, our parish conducted a major building assessment review to determine the physical state of our church building and what were the most pressing capital projects that need to be addressed. From the report, three major projects were determined as requiring the immediate attention of the parish. They include the state of the roof on the parish hall, the issue of large visible cracks on the concrete columns that support the church and the state of the central boiler that heats the entire building.

Those who take part in socials and gatherings in the parish hall know that it has been leaking for many years. This leaking became more substantial after the July 15th hailstorm that so damaged the roof it now requires an immediate replacement. The replacement of the parish roof will begin next week, and it was to our delight that our insurance company will cover nearly the entire expense of the roof repair. The Lord in His providence has allowed us a respite in this capital project to make it one that parish can readily afford and benefit from as our parish hall will now be a leak free and a safe environment for us to continue building community and fellowship. Let us thank Our Holy Mother and St. Anthony for allowing us to replace our parish hall roof at a minimal cost to the parish!

For the time of construction, which will hopefully conclude the first week of October, parish socials, functions, and group meetings in the parish hall will not be able to take place, meaning this Sunday will be our last social at least for the next few Sundays, thank you for your understanding.

The state of the concrete columns around the church has been a concern for some time when it was noticed that rust was beginning to appear in the concrete cracks. It was hoped that this was more of a cosmetic issue than one of structural integrity, but an independent report recently undertaken by a structural engineer at the end of June has unfortunately revealed the matter is one of structural integrity and requires immediate attention on 3 of the 18 columns to mitigate further damage and assure their safety, in addition to varying degrees of repair on the remaining 15 columns. The estimate for repairing the columns is in the 300-400K range and as such presents a major financial undertaking of our parish to raise the funds to undertake this necessary and immediate work that had not been budgeted or anticipated at this time. We have put this project out to tender

and secured a contractor, who under the constant supervision of the structural engineer who studied the columns, will undertake work on restoring all of the columns.

Finally, the state of the boiler, which was installed in 1960, has begun to show signs that it can no longer be properly maintained to assure we do not have a catastrophic failure in the cold winter months. The replacement of the boiler had been considered in the early 2010's but at that time was determined the boiler still had another 10-15 years within it. The concern is this time had now elapsed and the boiler is not as reliable anymore.

Various options were considered for what type of boiler to serve as a replacement and the finance committee and I have determined the most cost affordable option that remains a high efficiency and easily serviceable boiler. The estimated cost of this new boiler is 125K and replacement of the boiler can hopefully occur in Summer 2024.

The Diocese of Calgary has given its support and approval for these three Capital projects to commence given the necessity of each of them for the sustained viability of our parish church. As such, as a parish, including both the English and Latin Mass communities, we must begin to fundraise for these endeavours.

Today I asked that each of us prayerfully consider what we can contribute. I am confident that each of us can contribute some amount to these necessary projects. Some will be able to contribute substantial amounts, others more modest, but everyone of us can give some amount that will be both sacrificial and generous in helping to fund these necessary projects.

There is an incentive for us to raise these funds sooner than later to avoid needing to take out a substantial loan with the Diocese of Calgary that will incur interest and result in the parish paying much more in the long term.

Our parish does have funds saved in the central saving fund of the Diocese to assist in funding these projects, including donations that were made in the past

for a new boiler. But we cannot rely on these funds alone to pay for these three projects. Funds that you donate for these projects will go directly to them and not be diverted to other parish operating costs, which remain essential for our ongoing operation or diocesan initiatives like TIA, which our parish remains obligated to meet in our 2023 goal.

I appreciate this news will come as an unwanted surprise and I look forward to discussing these matters in more detail with those who would like. But as we will pray today, we are to know peace and experience the grace that prayer brings when we gather in this house of prayer to offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass to our God in heaven.

We are so very blessed to have this church building and we have taken care of it for many years. A new chapter in this building is beginning where major repairs are necessary and can be delayed no longer, but it also shows the vitality and faith of this community that we Sunday after Sunday gather here and desire for St. Anthony's to remain a place where God reigns and where we are united as the People of God.

With God all things are possible and so too I believe it shall be in this endeavour. I thank you in advance for your support as our fundraising begins and also invite those with fundraising experience to please share with me other initiatives we can explore to supplement our fundraising endeavours.

May we especially entrust our fundraising efforts and the success of these projects to Our Lady, Mother of the Church and St. Anthony, our patron and worker of countless miracles and favours over the centuries.
