### Pastoral Notes


#### Called to the Lord's Vineyard

It seems unfair that those in this Sunday's parable who work just a few hours get the same wage as those who laboured from the break of dawn. But as the Prophet Isaiah teaches us, God's ways are not our ways nor His thoughts our thoughts.

Jesus meant this parable to be a teaching on at what point in someone's life they are called to come and follow Him. Many of us were called at the break of dawn, that is, when we were baptized as infants and made children of God and members of the Holy Church. Others entered the vineyard at one of the daytime or afternoon hours, that is, at some point from our teenage years into adulthood, perhaps through RCIA, by getting married to a Catholic or having been baptized in another ecclesial community before entering into Full Communion with the Catholic Church. Others do not become part of the Church of Christ until the final hours of the workday, that is, as life comes to an end and one finally decides to become a Catholic before they breathe their last.

But whenever we are called, the final payment is the same: The gift of eternal life in the Kingdom of Heaven if we have faithfully laboured with the Lord, sought forgiveness of our sins and persevered in the faith until our final day on earth.

What Jesus wants us to appreciate is that we should rejoice at what hour someone is called to come and follow Him and not be in any way jealous that those who have been Catholic for less time than others will receive the same reward of heaven. What is essential is that we work together to daily strengthen one another in our respective vocations and rejoice when more people join the Lord's harvest when they ask to become part of the Catholic Church.


