
Pastoral Notes

Prepare the Way

It is believed that the site of Jesus' baptism and the ministry of St John the Baptist is a small oasis on the Jordan River that marks the border between the modern day states of Israel and Jordan. While the location is very beautiful and a refuge of vegetation and water in an otherwise harsh, rocky and sandy desert landscape, the entire site of the Lord's baptism is surrounded by barbwire and multiple signs warning you that if you breach the security fence you are standing in a live minefield and putting your very life in danger!

When I visited this holy site, I was intrigued by the warning signs of live mines awaiting just a few feet from me and thought how explosive and dangerous the message of St John the Baptist was for everyone who listened to his preaching and accepted his baptism. His words were truly explosive in the call to repent and change from a life of sin to one of grace and his call to conversion was dangerous to both his enemies who resented him calling out their hypocrisy and to penitent souls who knew they now had to live very differently, free from sinful vices and open to the saving power of the Lamb of God whom the Baptist too had baptized.

It may be the words of the Gospel today strike us explosive and dangerous in what God is calling us to undertake, but let us not be afraid, for with his grace we can walk this path with the Lord.



ST ANTHONY'S ADVENT CHRISTMAS HAMPER PROJECT


Christmas Angels: remember to bring your gift and angel to St. Anthony's Church on or before December 10th. There will be a table at the back of the church to receive your gifts.
