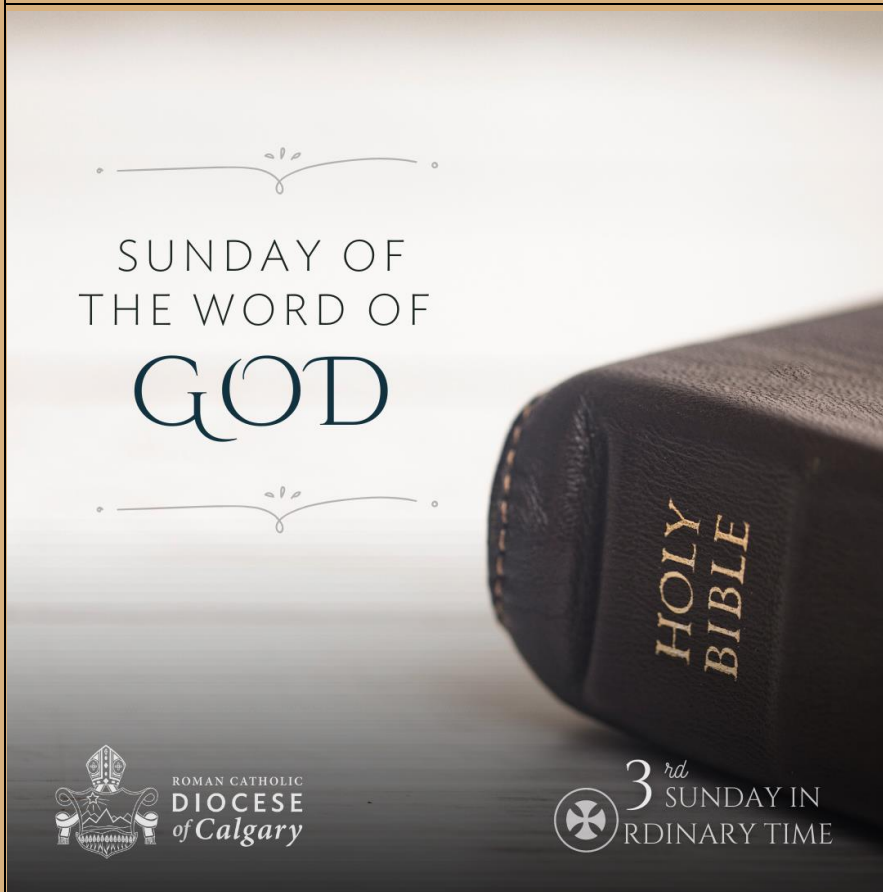

Pastoral Notes

Reluctant Prophets

Jonah is among those Old Testament prophets who were very reluctant to obey the voice of God. We are familiar with the story of him trying to sail away from God, only to be swallowed by a whale and spat up back where he started to undertake the incredibly difficult task of calling Nineveh to repent and avoid destruction.

Not only was the task of calling an entire city to repentance seemingly impossible, but personally it must have cost Jonah great anxiety since Nineveh was the capital of the Assyrian Empire who many years before had entirely destroyed the Kingdom of Israel and scattered 10 of its 12 tribes all over the ancient world, never again to be united again as a single nation under the God of Israel. Jonah was being commanded by God to call the oppressors of his people to repent so as to be saved from destruction and in a sense being asked by God also to forgive those who had done such great evil.

So too God might ask us to undertake the difficult task of calling someone to repent of their sins after he or she had personally harmed us or others that we care about. In these moments, God is also asking us to forgive our enemies and pray for those who persecuted us, which we know is a noble thing to do but one that costs us, and often costs us dearly. Let us ask God to support us if we are called to act in a prophetic manner similar to Jonah and live out one of those beatitudes that Jesus said makes one blessed and happy.

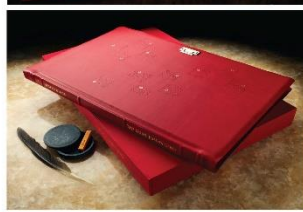

Please join us to learn about and experience 'The Saint John's Bible. Brad Neary, Director of the Heritage Program, will share the history of the original manuscript as well as details of the full-sized printed version, referred to as the Heritage Edition. Neary will have one volume – Gospels and Acts – of the Heritage Edition on display and will share several of the work's most iconic illuminations.

The Saint John's Bible is the first-handwritten, illuminated Bible commissioned by a Benedictine monastery in 500 years. It was commissioned in 1998 by the Benedictine monastery of Saint John's Abbey and Saint John's University to ignite the spiritual imagination of people throughout the world and to illuminate the word of God for a new millennium.

The Saint John's Bible was created by a team of scribes, artists and craftspeople in a scriptorium in Wales under the artistic direction of Donald Jackson, one of the world's foremost calligraphers and the Scribe to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II's Crown Office at the House of Lords in London, England.
