Pastoral Notes


Harden not your hearts

The Pope, cardinals, bishops, priests, deacons, religious brothers and sisters and many members of the lay faithful spend their day praying the Liturgy of the Hours. This is collection of prayers, mostly of scripture but with writings from the saints and magisterial documents, is prayed anywhere from 5 to 9 times a day at different times such as before dawn, in the morning, at noonday, after sunset and just before retiring for bed. It is consoling to think that 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, someone is praying on of the office of the Liturgy of the Hours, whether out of obligation by clerics and religious or voluntarily by members of the laity, meaning God is being praised without ceasing and the Church at every moment is immersed in praying.

There are different ways to begin the Liturgy of the Hours but most often it begins with the recitation of Psalm 95, which is the responsorial psalm this Sunday. I personally have prayed this psalm daily for almost 20 years, meaning I have recited this psalm, now from memory in English (and I am trying to memorize in Latin with slow progress) thousands upon thousands of times. The danger of praying the same psalm day after day is that you say it without really focusing on its contents or meaning the words that you are saying and so the need to pause and consider what is being prayed is important.

The image of not hardening your heart is one that often speaks to me. A hardened heart was among the worst spiritual conditions that afflicted a member of the People of God because it meant that someone no longer wanted to have a relationship with God and His People, essentially cutting themselves off from God's love and stubbornly and pridefully wanting to live life by their own rules, expectations, wants and desires. The more hardened the heart became, the more the person drifted away from God and became consumed by themselves, which in the end brings a deep and perpetual sadness and loneliness that is very much an experience of hell here on earth.

My dear friends in Christ, let us be sure to continually check our spiritual hearts every day and if they are in any way becoming hardened and hostile to the Love of God, let us ask the Lord to bring us that grace and healing our hearts require to be drawn back to Him.
