Pastoral Notes


One last chance for Alleluias

This Sunday sees Ordinary Time take a significant pause before it will resume towards the end of May and with it will come a pause in singing any hymns or compositions that use the word Alleluia. Some churches retain the custom of "burying" a small banner with the word Alleluia prior to the beginning of Lent, signifying how this word will not be uttered during the Lenten Fast but will "rise again" when it is sung at the Easter Vigil. If you will, we fast from saying a word that is filled with such meaning and importance as a way to rekindle our love for it when Easter arrives.

For the Jewish People, to word Alleluia (often spelt Hallelujah) was to be said or sung in a prayer or hymns of praise, rejoicing and jubilant exaltation. It was a word that was used intentionally where someone was to mean what they said or sung and not say it too casually or without due honour.

It is most fittingly sung in the Easter Season as we rejoice in the glory of the resurrection and most fittingly omitted during Lent to show that we are entering into a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving as means to purify us of our sins and prepare ourselves well to celebrate in the Easter Season.

Let us say and sing the word Alleluia well for the next few days before it steps aside on Ash Wednesday, as a way to remind ourselves of our need for Lent each and every year as the necessary way prepare ourselves for Easter and its promise of eternal life.





Today's Gospel says that "Jesus was moved with pity when He saw a leper". Are you moved with love and compassion when you see the outcasts of today's society? Today, Jesus continues to call forward men and women to minister as he did.
