
The Church, Our Mother

Throughout the Old Testament, the city of Jerusalem was affectionately likened to a caring mother. Both those who resided in the Holy City and those who made the short and long pilgrimages to pray in the Temple and observe the high holy feast days found joy in seeing this remarkable city situated on the heights of Mt Zion.

Those who mourned for the trials they faced and the sins they committed could rejoice that Jerusalem would provide them access to the Temple and its sacrifices to expiate sins and console someone in times of hardship. The prophets even vividly spoke of Jerusalem to be like a nursing mother, nourishing the people of God with the spiritual milk of prayer, sacrifice and comfort that God dwelt in that holy city and was there to strengthen His people.

It is not surprising that the first Christians would begin to speak of the Church, the new and heavenly Jerusalem, both in heaven and on earth and in purgatory, as a consoling mother, strengthening her children in the valley of tears that we experience in life and nourishing with a new spiritual milk of the Sacraments, prayer and treasury of devotions, indulgences, teachings and manifold ways we are being brought to God.


Might we spend this Laetare or Rejoice Sunday considering how we relate to the Church as a spiritual mother. St Cyprian was bold in asserting that we cannot have God as our Father if we do not have the Church as our mother! It may be that the Church has not always been a loving and consoling mother to us as often a good mother needs to show discipline and tough love to her children. But might we rekindle in our hearts a love for the Church and discover in her our true spiritual mother that is leading us onward to eternal life.


