Pastoral Notes

Be like the Apostle Philip

Of the 12 Apostles, Sts Peter, James and John feature most prominently in the 4 Gospels. The other remaining 9 apostles are sparsely mentioned, with some like St Simon the Zealot having no recorded words attributed to him. So too is St Philip mentioned very little in the Gospels but the few appearances he makes show a notable characteristic: that he was always looking to bring people to Jesus.

We read today that he brought some Greeks to see Jesus. This is notable since many Jews in the time of Jesus were hesitant to seek out converts to their faith from among the Gentiles, preferring to focus their efforts on helping their fellow Jews to lead more devout lives than to take the risk of trying to bring Gentiles into the fold, which would demand much greater efforts and patience as they sought to turn away from a pagan life to one rooted in the law of God and eventually the Gospel of Christ and teachings of His Church.

But St Philip did not shy away from the challenge of inviting Gentiles to come and see Jesus and begin the work of conversion to the Lord.

To what extent do you and I act like St Philip in seeking out those who seem furthest from Christ and will demand a lot of time and effort to patiently work with them to come to know the truth, joy and beauty of our faith? Might we seek the intercession of this great Apostle in our own efforts to bring many to see Christ and have their lives transformed.

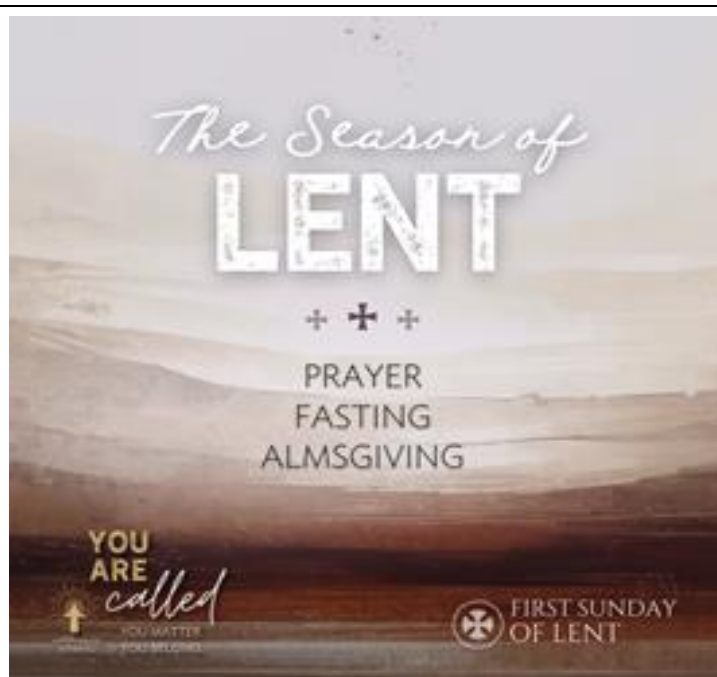

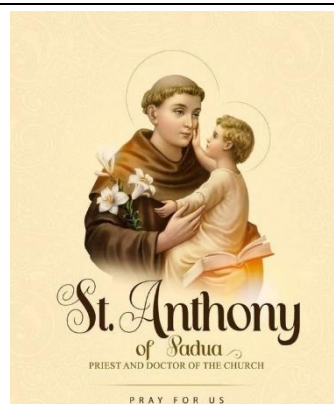
