Pastoral Notes

The Temple of His Body

It was unthinkable that the Jerusalem temple would be destroyed (again). Herod had assured the temple was among the finest in the ancient world and even the Romans, who were not shy of causing disturbance in God's temple, did not look to raise it despite continued uprisings from Jewish zealots and assassins. All that would change when the Temple was destroyed and never to be rebuilt after its destruction in 70 AD, but the temple Jesus was referring to was not the one Titus and the 10th Legion would destroy, but the most remarkable temple to have ever existed, the Body of Christ.

When Jesus lay in the sleep of peace, it seemed as if the finest of all temples would never shine again. No longer could people look upon the countenance of He who had healed so many and whose hands, now pierced, had worked countless miracles.

But we know and believe this ruined temple would be rebuilt in glory when he would rise again from the dead. The Resurrection assured not only that the Body of Christ would be restored to life, but that this temple would begin to exist beyond himself as the Church, His Mystical Body.

The Church is the temple of Christ's Body, its members are made up of all those who are baptized into Him, making our church much more than just an institution and religious organization but a mystical and spiritual body, with Christ as our head and we as its members.

This should be a reminder to us that our call to love our fellow Catholics is also to love Christ and His body, the Church, of which we are all a part of. May Lent be a time for us to renew our love for the Church, the body and temple of Christ, of which you and I are members.

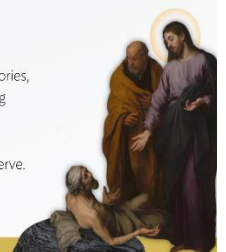

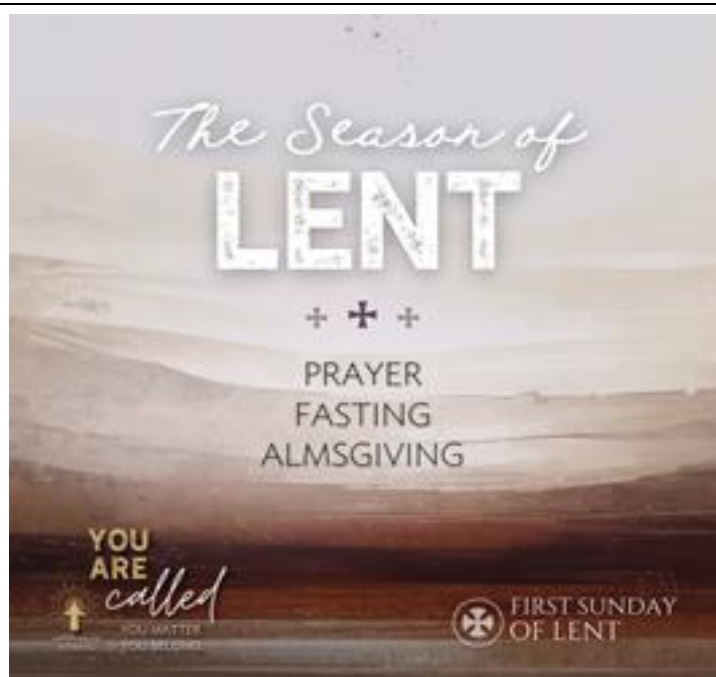
