Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Since October 4, 2023, the Memorial of St. Francis of Assisi, we have embarked on a journey of pastoral renewal in the Diocese of Calgary. This renewal invites all members of our Diocese to focus ourselves and the parish communities on three areas of pastoral priority: 1) to be formed as missionary disciples of our Lord; 2) to be a Church of encounter and witness; and 3) to strengthen family life.

An essential step of the renewal journey involves gaining insights into our current pastoral reality and acknowledging the ways in which the Lord has been active in our lives and within our parishes. To facilitate this process, the Diocese has partnered with the Flourishing Congregations Institute at Ambrose University in Calgary to develop the Pastoral Renewal Survey, inviting your valuable input.

This survey is open to any parishioner in the Diocese aged 18 years or older. Participation is completely voluntary and your confidentiality will be maintained.

Please know that no one in your parish or Diocese will have access to individual responses; all responses are being collected by the Flourishing Congregations Institute, and we will have no way of linking responses with individuals.

Upon completion of the survey, a report will be generated for each parish and for the Diocese as a whole. These findings will be accessible to all participants through the parish and Diocese. Your valuable participation in this survey will help us to better understand and support you, our parishes, and the Diocese on our journey of conversion and renewal.

- We encourage all parishioners to bring a portable electronic device (e.g., cell phone, iPad) to complete the online survey at the end of Mass during the weekend of June 1-2, 2024.
- For those who prefer a paper option, copies will be available.
- If you are unable to attend and participate that weekend, the survey will remain accessible online via the parish's website until June 14.

About the Survey

Bishop McGrattan convened a meeting with clergy, parish staff, and Parish Renewal Team chairs to share information regarding the forthcoming Diocesan-wide Pastoral Renewal Survey. The survey will be conducted during all weekend Masses on June 1 and June 2 across every parish. Key details of the survey are outlined below. Additional information will be provided in your parish bulletin this weekend.

- 1. **Purpose**: The survey serves as a crucial step in our journey of renewal, aiming to gain insights into our current pastoral reality and recognize the active presence of the Lord in our lives and parishes.
- 2. Content: Feedback sought in the survey aligns with the model of parish life that authentically responds to the nature of the Christian community and addresses the specific needs of our Church today, particularly focusing on the three areas of diocesan pastoral priority: formation, community, and family. Specific areas of inquiry include parishioners' demographics, faith practices, and experiences within the parish.
- 3. **Participation**: The survey is open to all parishioners aged 18 years or older within the Diocese, and participation is entirely voluntary. Parishioners can complete the survey in-pew using their parish-specific URL or QR code. A paper option is also available.
- 4. **Time**: All parishes will conduct the survey during the weekend Masses of June 1 and June 2. Additionally, the survey link will be accessible on parish websites and social media platforms from **June 1 to June 14**.
- 5. **Benefit**: Each parish will receive a generated report and analysis containing crucial insights for their parish community. These findings will aid parish leadership and renewal teams in their pastoral renewal planning in the fall of 2024.

Pastoral Update

As the Lord once ascended into heaven above, I too will soon be making my own ascent and descent to the sweltering heat of Washington DC for round three of canon law studies and before I depart, I want to make an important financial update on our boiler project.

Plans to replace the boiler have been in motion for a number of years, but it has been in the past 2 years that the urgency to replace the boiler has been realized. In Fall 2023, we were fortunate to obtain replacement parts for the boiler to get it through another winter but were warned replacement parts were becoming nearly impossible to obtain.

In the start of winter 2024, we received the unfortunate news that our long-time boiler technician would no longer be able to service the boiler and finding a replacement for him for such an antique model has proved challenging.

The boiler also behaved very strangely this winter, many of you who attend adoration in the chapel endured strange gargling noises in the pipes for many weeks, while parts of the church building lost heat entirely, notably the rectory on its north side where my bedroom and sitting room are. It was a cold winter for me friends, but worry not, I grew up in a log home with a mother who sparingly put on the furnace so I run cold (and its good ice climbing training), but the concern was whether or not pipes could have frozen and caused extensive damage.

All this is to say the boiler needs to be replaced, and replaced now. We hired TYZ engineering firm to do an extensive study on our boiler and prepare the specifications for its replacement. The project went out to tender in the past months and the winning bid was given to Arpi's Industries, a long standing and trusted HVAC and heating company in Calgary and whose founder Arpi Berdin I learned was among the original members of St. Anthony's church.

The two new boilers and pumps have been ordered and we expect work to begin in June and conclude in the middle of September. We are hoping there will not be too many disruptions to the Mass schedule but will give everyone ample warning if this occurs.

What will be the boiler replacement cost? Due to some unknown factors in the boiler installation that could incur change orders and additional costs, the project has risen from what we budgeted to be 200-250K to the new price of 400k.

I appreciate this is another big ask of our parish after we just completed the column restoration project.

Dear friends, I must thank everyone profoundly for the incredible outpouring of generosity we received last year. Not only did we increase and maintain our donations for general operations, but we also collected nearly 390k for the columns, meaning between those funds and those which we withdrew from our central savings, the column restoration project has been paid in full. Last year also saw expenses incurred for the insurance deductibles on the roof replacements, brick restoration, a hot water tank exploding, and repairs being needed in the kitchen as a result and other minor repairs.

Pastoral Update

This has left our parish with approximately 130k in our central savings and another 100k in our bank account that we can access while making sure we have 3 months operating funds in our bank account at all times. This means that we require between 200-300k more to complete the boiler project, with the hopes that we could raise upwards of 400-500k so as to not have to access what remains in our central savings and so leave that money there in the event of another major repair, which is becoming more common in our church as it approaches its 75th anniversary.

Taking out a loan with the diocese to pay for the new boiler is not an ideal course of action but one that we have been given permission to undertake if necessary and accept the additional cost of the interest that will be incurred for doing so.

Another big challenge for us my friends, not unlike what the Apostles faced as they returned rejoicing to Jerusalem to await the Holy Spirit and prepare to guide the Church through the winds and waves that have never ceased to batter and toss her about. But let us have confidence we can face this boiler project in a similar spirit of trust, generosity and determination to continue to make St. Anthony's a parish in which Christ is alive, our faith evident for all to see, and free of that spirit of fear that causes such harm when challenge and crisis confront us.

I thank you all once again for the generosity you have shown and am humbled by the donations you can offer to fund our new boiler, especially in the personal and familial sacrifice that those donations may entail.

May St Anthony continue to be with us and Holy Mother, Mother of the Church, protect us and intercede on our behalf.

Be assured of my prayers this summer and kindly remember me in your prayers.






