Pastoral Notes

Who wrote the Letter to the Hebrews?

When reading the New Testament, you will notice that the Gospels and Letters contained within are attributed to various individuals who either knew Jesus Christ or were baptized by those who knew the Lord. The Gospel writers Sts. Matthew, Mark and John all knew the Lord, while St Luke never did but was baptized by St Paul, who himself it seems never knew Jesus while the Lord was engaged in His public ministry but encountered Him in His risen glory on the road to Damascus. Sts. Peter, James, John and Jude were all Apostles of Christ and wrote letters that are contained in the New Testament, in addition to the many letters of St Paul, which are the fruit of his conversion and dedication to proclaim the Gospel of the one whom he first sought to persecute. The author of the Acts of the Apostles has long been understood to be St Luke and is seen as a continuation of the story he began in his Gospel, while the Book of Revelation has long been attributed to St John, the beloved disciple and only apostle to not experience martyrdom.

But there is one letter in the New Testament that does not have an author definitively attributed to it. That is the Letter to the Hebrews, of which we will read from in the Second Reading of the Sunday Mass for the next few weeks. Many have rightly suggested it was written by St Paul and there is much evidence to support this claim, while others say it was written by St Barnabas or perhaps a temple priest who was baptized and brought his intimate knowledge of the sacrifices performed in the Jerusalem Temple into the contents of this letter to reveal Jesus as the Eternal High Priest of the New Covenant. Because numerous authors have been proposed as having written this Letter to the Hebrews, the Church currently withholds definitively assigning a name to the author of this letter of the New Testament, yet this takes nothing away from the beauty and authority of its content and message.

I invite you to pay close attention to the Second Reading at Sunday Mass from the Letter to the Hebrews and make it a source of your prayer and meditation over the coming weeks.

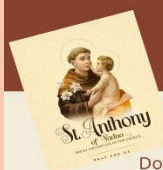
