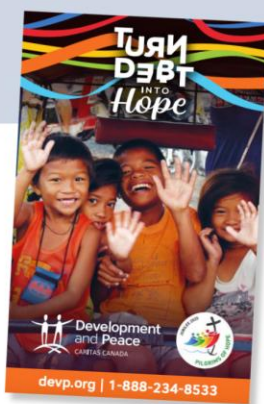


A message from

Pastoral Notes

I Am The Resurrection and The Life

Whenever we recite the Nicene or Apostles Creed, we profess our belief in the Resurrection of the Dead. To deny that we will rise again is to deny a fundamental truth of our faith that the Church has always believed and will hold as true until the end of time.

Yet it may come as a surprise to learn that those who lived in the time of the Old Testament took many centuries to come to believe in the resurrection of the dead. In the first books of the Old Testament, you will not find any references to the dead rising to new life. This truth of our faith was slowly revealed to God's people over many centuries, most notably in the teaching of the prophets and what are known as the wisdom books of the Bible.

The prophet Ezekiel witnessed a remarkable vision wherein he saw a valley of dry bones and witnessed as bone, sinew and flesh reunited and the dead rose from their graves after the spirit of God was placed within them. He marveled that those who were thought to be forever in the sleep of death had now returned to realm of the living.

When Our Lord brought Lazarus back to life, it was a sign that the greatest tragedy of all, death itself, had been overcome and that we too would experience what happened to Lazarus. True, Jesus wept for Lazarus as we all are inclined to do when we lose someone we love. But as the psalmist says, those who sow in tears will reap with sounds of joy because our faith in the resurrection assures us that death is not the end, but a path we all must take and one that can end in both eternal life in heaven and the resurrection of the blessed.

Let us take time this week to consider what the resurrection of the dead will be like and ask God to strengthen our hope in this great mystery that will unfold at the end of all things.

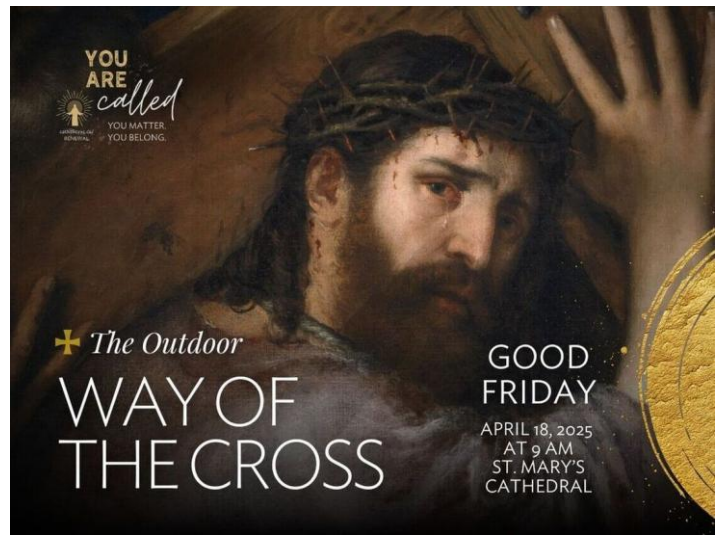

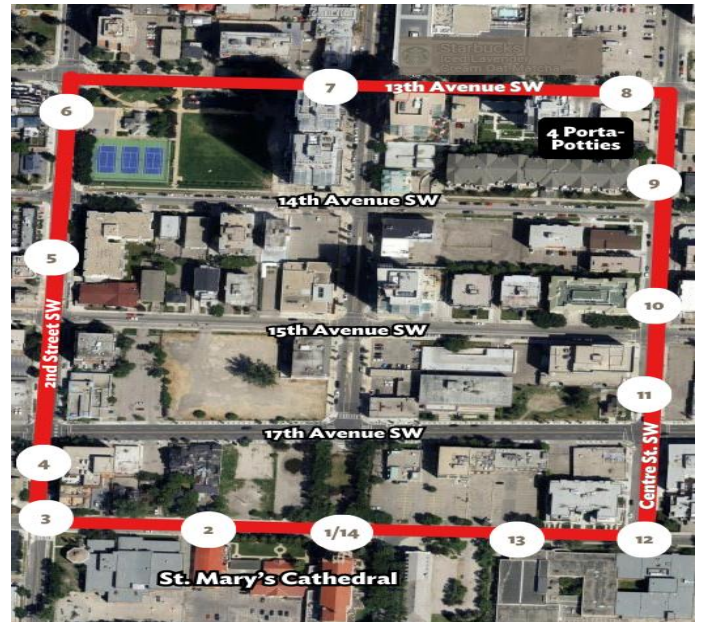
